Period	Patient's Blood Pressure	Normal Blood Pressure
Daytime (awake)	142/87 mmHg	<135/85 mmHg
Nighttime (asleep)	125/75 mmHg	<120/70 mmHg
24-hour	135/85 mmHg	<130/80 mmHg

Interpretation:

Elevated ambulatory blood pressure consistent with sustained hypertension.

Recommendation:

Initiate treatment for hypertension.
